About the University

Magadh University was established on March 1, 1962 as a consequence of the earnest wishes and efforts of the intellectuals and educationists of the Magadh region. Its foundation echoed the conversion of the long cherished dream of the people of this region into reality. Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan, the then President of India laid the foundation stone of this university. Magadh University enjoys the honour of being one of the largest universities in Bihar, with its 19 constituent colleges, 69 affiliated colleges, 2 law colleges and one minority college spread over the districts of Gaya, Nawada, Jehanabad, Arwal, and Aurangabad. This serene centre of learning nestles in a vast area of land in the vicinity of Bodh Gaya, the holy seat of Lord Buddha's enlightenment. The University offers regular courses to cater to the demands of diverse categories of students rendering knowledge from traditional, vocational and professional programmes to switch over to the needs of the present time.

In the early 1930s, Indian scholars of English Literature began to feel the need of a platform where scholars of English Literature of the country could assemble to discuss and deliberate on various issues related to English teaching and research in India. As a result the first formal Association was formed at Allahabad University in the year 1937 and with the passage of time the Association took its shape as The Indian Association for English Studies (IAES). Later on it was registered in 2007 as the Association for English Studies of India (AESI). Keeping in view the aims and objectives of AESI, its governing body plans and executes its academic activities. Organizing an annual conference in any part of India is one of the major activities of the Association. It will also encourage comparative and interdisciplinary approaches by drawing on world literatures, translation studies, cultural studies, post-colonial and decolonial perspectives, eco-criticism, media studies and more. By widening the lens beyond any single national or linguistic tradition, the 69th AIETC aspires to create a vibrant platform for cross-cultural, cross-disciplinary exchange. The conference aligns with evolving educational priorities, including the NEP curriculum and global approaches to English and comparative literature. In an era marked by rapid change and contested identities, understanding the narratives that guide, question, and inspire societies is more crucial than ever. We welcome all participants to join us in Bodh-Gaya to reflect, research, and reimagine the dynamic interplay between literature, language and the ongoing story of human society.

Guidelines for submitting the Research Paper

The scholars who are willing to participate in the 69th All India English Teachers' Conference (AIETC) under the aegis of the AESI are advised to prepare and submit their research papers as per the following guidelines:

- Papers will be accepted in MS Word only.
- Research papers must be typed in Times New Roman, in font size 12 for regular text and font size 14 for titles with double spacing.
- The maximum word limit of a research paper is 2500-3000, including abstract in 200 words, followed by keywords.
- Latest MLA Style (8/9 edition of MLA Handbook) must be used for all citations.
- Name of the author must be put only at the right margin of the page below the main title and short biographical note with email and contact number at the end of the paper.
- Research paper without the registration fee will not be accepted.
- Abstract and complete research paper must be submitted at the following e-mail address. 69aietcmu@gmail.com
- Abstract must be uploaded in the google form at the given link too : <https://forms.gle/WrzYJYKxmcPKomPg6>
- Hard copy of the research paper must be submitted at the time of presentation in the Conference.
- The proceedings of the Conference will be published with an ISBN.
